India poised for a major place in higher education: UGC chairman

India is poised for a major place in higher education in the coming days as better funding and better realization of quality education are in the offing in the country now, UGC chairman Prof Virander Singh Chauhan, said here today.



He was delivering the convocation address of the ninth annual convocation of Ravenshaw University here.

Calling upon the students to grab the opportunity as privileged sections of society, the UGC chairman said higher education is in a transitional period now with the invasion of technology in education.

He however, disapproved the idea that successful education is only making the students capable of getting a job the day they step out of the universities.

"Education is the training of mind. You may be taught something in the class, but you learn much more outside the class by interacting with others", Chauhan said adding that education is to learn from others, to be able to appreciate someone's view to be better than yours and to have a sense of entitlement.



CM, government discuss higher education issues

Chief minister Nitish Kumar along with senior officials of the state government had detailed discussion with governor-cum-chancellor Satya Pal Malik on Monday on various issues related to higher education in the state.

Malik apprised the CM with the important decisions taken at a meeting with the vice-chancellors held at Raj Bhavan on November 25 and sought state government cooperation in their implementation for revamping the higher education system in the state.

It was decided in the meeting with the VCs that all the universities would frame their academic and examination calendars latest by March-end and regularize their academic sessions as soon as possible. The universities were also asked to ensure implementation of biometric attendance for their teachers, research scholars and non-teaching staff. The syllabi of different courses in different universities, which have not been revised for the last several years, would be updated and revised latest by March 2018.

The chancellor had asked the VCs to take necessary steps for improving the quality of research, timely payment of retirement benefits to university teachers and staff, strengthening of grievance redressal cells, enforcement of financial discipline, getting colleges and universities accredited by NAAC and promotion of sports and cultural activities in universities. The VCs were also asked not to grant affiliation to the colleges which lacked common room with attached toilets for girl students.

The CM is reported to have appreciated the decisions and assured of government's full cooperation in their implementation.

Chief secretary Anjani Kumar Singh, education department principal secretary R K Mahajan, principal secretary to governor Brijesh Mehrotra and CM's principal secretary Chanchal Kumar also participated in the deliberations.

Dr AI Vilayathullah, Assistant Professor of Govt. College, Malappuram, spoke about 'Learning, Teaching, Aesthetics and Research: A Quranic Exploration'.

Dr. P Muhamed Ilyas, College Principal and Dr M Zahira, former head of the Department of English also spoke at the valedictory session.

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Funded by the Kerala State Higher Education Council, the conference was attended by nearly 500 delegates from various parts of the country.
